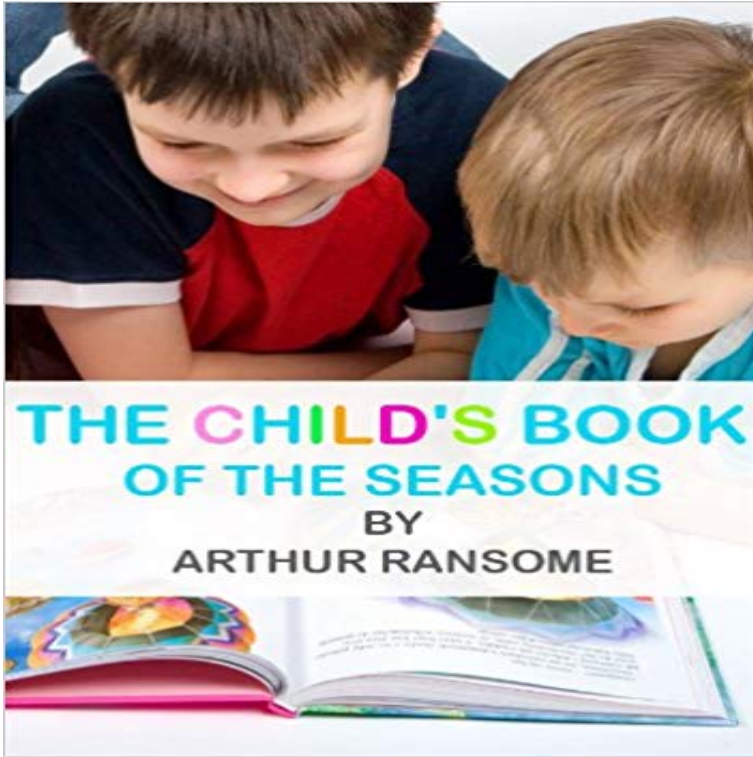


# The Childs Book of the Seasons : Books for Childrens
