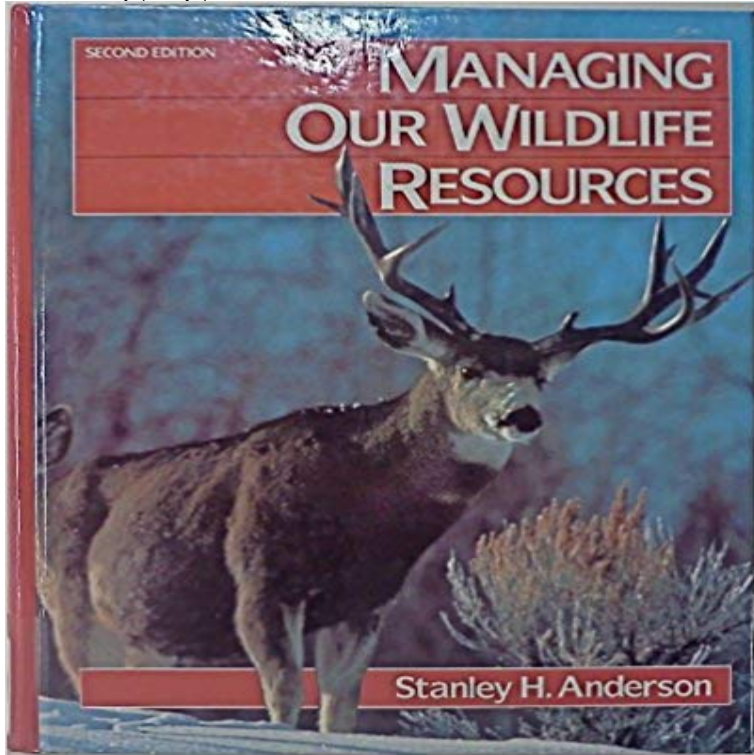


# Managing Our Wildlife Resources
