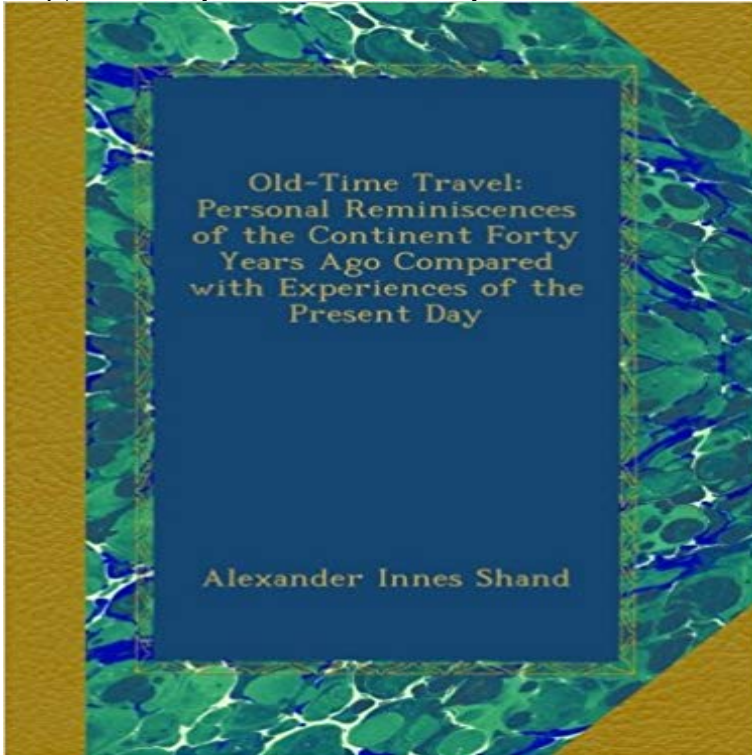


Old-Time Travel: Personal Reminiscences of the Continent Forty Years Ago Compared with Experiences of the Present Day
